

PUBLIC SAFETY COMMITTEE MINUTES

DATE OF MEETING: February 4, 2016 at 7:00 a.m. – County Building

MEMBERS PRESENT: Cris Rogers – Chair, Sue Whitted, David Newberg, Christy Pruser and Cole Ritter.

MEMBERS ABSENT: None

SUMMARY OF DISCUSSION:

- Tamara McFeeters, Animal Control Officer, was present and submitted her monthly report.
- Committee discussed purchasing several items for the new shelter.
 - Mini refrigerator with a lock for \$199.00
 - Surgical instrument stand - \$156.00
 - Canine scale - \$925.00
 - Mobile IV stand - \$98.00All of these items could be purchased with donation funds. Motion by Rogers, 2nd by Newberg to refer these items to Finance, due to them not being on the agenda, for action. Voice vote, motion carried.
- Tamara informed the committee that Cadet Troop 3039 toured the shelter recently. They are required to do a wood project and want to do the project for the new shelter. They also want to sponsor a drive for the shelter.
- Tamara asked if the cameras donated by the power plant would be moved out to the new shelter. Rogers explained that this would be looked at – not sure they are needed at the new location.
- Rogers stated that the committee would need to address working hours, shelter hours soon.
- Motion by Whitted, 2nd by Ritter to approve last month's minutes. Voice vote, motion carried.
- Motion by Pruser, 2nd by Whitted to approve the claims with the addition of one to NAPA. Voice vote, motion carried.
- Reviewed quote from Wilson-Schleder for a 10x9 steel overhead door with opener at the new shelter/storage area for \$3600.00. Motion by Rogers, 2nd by Ritter to recommend to the full board to accept the quote from Wilson-Schleder for an overhead door with opener at a cost of \$3600.00. Voice vote, motion carried. Second Chance is willing to pay for the concrete in this area.
- Rogers indicated that the West end of the shelter/storage facility has only one overhead door with no entrance door. Reviewed quote from Wilson-Schleder to install a walk thru door at a cost of \$1200.00. Motion by Rogers, 2nd by Whitted to recommend to the full board to accept the quote from Wilson-Schleder to install a walk thru door on the West end of the storage building for \$1200.00. Voice vote, motion carried.
- Rogers indicated that he had been in contact with Garver Seeds regarding bulk cat food, dog food and litter. Also looking into purchasing 2 or possibly 3 bulk food containers.
- Discussion/review of the punch list items at the new shelter.
- Teresa Barnett, EMA Coordinator, was present and submitted her monthly report.
- Teresa Barnett presented 3 travel requests:
 - Pipeline training on February 22 in Decatur for Teresa and Lana. No cost associated with training.
 - Search and Rescue Management Training in Bloomington on March 12 and 13 for Teresa. Possible cost for lunches.

- Central IL Weather Net Conference in Peoria on March 5 for Teresa and Lana. This course will count towards the required training. Teresa does not believe there is a cost associated with this conference.
