

## PUBLIC SAFETY COMMITTEE MINUTES

**DATE OF MEETING:** January 10, 2018 at 7:00 a.m. County Building

**MEMBERS PRESENT:** Cris Rogers – Chair, Christy Pruser, David Newberg, Sue Whitted and Lance Reece. Also present Dee Rentmeister, County Administrator. Pruser left at 7:35 a.m.

### **SUMMARY OF DISCUSSION:**

- Motion by Rogers, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Whitted to approve last months' minutes. Voice vote, motion carried.
- Motion by Rogers, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Pruser to approve the claims. Voice vote, motion carried.
- Discussion on construction of a wall in the backroom of the animal shelter where the 2<sup>nd</sup> garage is. This will create additional storage and make a separate room for feral cats. General discussion on feral cats. Motion by Rogers, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Whitted to authorize the maintenance department to construct an insulated wall at the animal shelter at a cost not to exceed \$1500.00. Voice vote, motion carried.
- Melanie Kinney, Animal Control Administrator, was present to discuss several topics with the committee.
  - The pet population fund and how the program works. Gloria Wills, County Treasurer, explained to the committee how the fund generates money. If the County does not have a pet population fund then the money collected by the Treasurer would be submitted to the State and county residents could fill out the paperwork and utilize the program thru the State. Second Chance organizes the low cost spay/neuter program and then submits a claim for reimbursement from the County. The latest claim submitted by Second Chance covered 15 months. Currently there is only approximately \$945 left in this year's budget to spend. Also discussed whether the \$15.00 copay was being collected by Second Chance and applied to the bill from the APL. Committee felt that there needed to be a meeting with Second Chance to talk about the pet population program. Reece and one other member will meet with Second Chance.
  - The Housing Authority is not ensuring that their renters are keeping their animals current on rabies and registration with the county. This poses a risk to the health and safety of the many residents that live in the housing units.
  - Possibility of looking into offering an inhouse rabies clinic in the Fall.
- Motion by Reece, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Whitted to adjourn at 8:04 a.m. Voice vote, motion carried.
