Reviewed a contract with Consolidated Communications who would install the fiber link and equipment. Contract would be for 5 years with a monthly payment of \$2755.00. After discussion, a motion was made by Rogers, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Tilley to recommend to the full board to enter into a 5-year contract with Consolidated Communications for fiber link/services at a cost of \$2755.00 per month. Voice vote, motion carried.
- Motion by Tilley, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Newberg to approve last month's minutes. Voice vote, motion carried.
- Motion by Rogers, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Tilley to approve the claims. Voice vote, motion carried.
- The EMA Coordinator will be retiring August 31,2018. Need to recreate the position so that we can start advertising and possibly have a new coordinator hired and working/training prior to their last day. Motion by Tilley, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Newberg to recreate the EMA Coordinator position. Voice vote, motion carried.
- Discussion on setting a salary range for the EMA Coordinator position. Looked at the wages of EMA Coordinator's in nearby counties, those with a power plant and counties with similar population. Motion by Rogers, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Tilley to set the salary range for the EMA Coordinator position at \$33,000 \$40,000.00. Voice vote, motion carried.
- Discussion on the draft resolution supporting Stericycle's request to incinerate and transfer pharmaceutical and other medical waste at their facility. Motion by Rogers, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Newberg to recommend to the full board to adopt the resolution supporting Stericycle's request to incinerate and transfer pharmaceutical and other medical waste at their facility. Voice vote, motion carried.
- The latest supplement to the Code of Ordinances has been completed. Motion by Tilley, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Newberg to recommend to the full board to adopt the resolution adopting the supplement to the Code of Ordinances. Voice vote, motion carried.
- Tilley discussed with the committee the receipt of letters from a few townships asking for a moratorium on wind farms. General discussion on the letters, a moratorium and proposed revisions to the wind ordinance.

# RESOLUTION SUPPORTING STERICYCLE, INC.'S REQUEST TO INCINERATE AND TRANSFER PHARMACEUTICAL AND OTHER MEDICAL WASTE AT THE WASTE TREATMENT FACILITY AT 5815 WELDON SPRINGS ROAD

WHEREAS, on November 12, 1987, the County Board of DeWitt County, Illinois, granted site location approval under Section 39.2 of the Illinois Environmental Protection Act for the construction and operation of a pollution control facility located at 5815 Weldon Springs Road in Clinton, Illinois; and

WHEREAS, the County Board's site location approval authorized the construction and operation of a treatment facility for the sterilization and controlled air pyrolysis (incineration) of infectious and medical wastes and to provide other environmental and product distribution services to health care providers; and

WHEREAS, Stericycle, Inc. believes that the County Board's site location approval, although not specifically and expressly so stating, authorized the incineration of pharmaceutical wastes and the transfer of pharmaceutical and other medical wastes received at the facility to other permitted pollution control facilities; and

WHEREAS, Stericycle seeks clarification of the County Board's site location approval to confirm that Stericycle may incinerate pharmaceutical wastes received at the site and, when necessary or required by law, transfer pharmaceutical and other medical wastes received at the site to other, permitted pollution control facilities for appropriate disposal; and

WHEREAS, the County Board does not believe that it can clarify its site location approval as requested by Stericycle, in view of the fact that the approval was granted 30 years ago and none of the County Board members who voted to approve site location in 1987 are serving on the County Board today; and

WHEREAS, despite its belief that it cannot clarify the site location approval as Stericycle requests, the County Board fully supports Stericycle's proposal to incinerate pharmaceutical waste at the facility and to transfer pharmaceutical and other medical waste from the facility to other permitted pollution control facilities; and

WHEREAS, as the land on which the facility is located has, since the 1987 site location approval, been annexed by the City of Clinton, any formal request for site location approval authorizing the incineration and transfer of pharmaceutical and other medical wastes must be filed with the City of Clinton, not the County Board.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Board of DeWitt County, Illinois, that the County Board hereby expresses its support for Stericycle, Inc.'s proposal to incinerate pharmaceutical wastes received at the waste treatment facility located at 5815 Weldon Springs Road in Clinton, Illinois, and to transfer, when necessary or required by law, pharmaceutical and other medical wastes received at that site to other, permitted pollution control facilities for appropriate disposal. The County Board further expresses its support for any application for site location approval with respect to the proposed incineration and transfer operations that is filed by Stericycle under Section 39.2 of the Illinois Environmental Protection Act and submitted to the City Council for the City of Clinton.
