SUMMARY OF DISCUSSION:

- Motion by Houser, 2nd by Newberg to approve the claims. Voice vote, motion carried.
- Motion by Newberg, 2nd by Houser to approve last month's minutes. Voice vote, motion carried.
- Committee received official notice from Farmer City Fire Protection District wishing to enter into an intergovernmental agreement with the county for ambulance service. The County is currently working with the Fire Protection District and their attorney to draft an intergovernmental agreement and the State's Attorney is working with PSI to add an addendum to the current contract to include services to the Farmer City Fire Protection District. The documents should be ready for the full board meeting next week for final action. General discussion on when services would begin and how the billing would take place. Motion by Newberg, 2nd by Pruser to recommend to the full board to enter into an intergovernmental agreement with Farmer City Fire Protection District for ambulance services. Voice vote, motion carried. Motion by Pruser, 2nd by Houser to recommend to the full board to approve the addendum to the current (2019) agreement with PSI to include service to the Farmer City Fire Protection District. Voice vote, motion carried. Will put on the full board agenda for action to rescind the motion concerning putting a referendum question on the ballot concerning ambulance service for the Farmer City Fire Protection District.
- Discussion on golf cart usage in the County. Sheriff Walker and Mark Mathon, County Engineer were present and gave their thoughts should statute changes occur that could possibly allow for golf cart usage in the County. Currently there are no roads in the County that golf carts could use because the speed limit is 55 mph and statute only allow golf carts on roads 35 mph or less. Both Sheriff Walker and Mark Mathon indicated that they would be against allowing golf cart usage in the County.
- Micah Gallardo, EMA Director, was present and gave an update on the number of COVID-19 cases within the County.
- Discussion with the Sheriff concerning cars in the compound area at the Annex building.
- Discussion on the number of prisoners being held in the county jail due to the State refusing inmates that have been sentenced to IDOC. Will look into seeing if these expenses can be reimbursed to the county thru CURE, the Coronavirus Relief Fund Assistance for Local Government.
